A total of 658,669 lives lost to ensure our liberties and freedoms. It's one thing to share numbers, but another to be an eye witness to the death of a fellow soldier and friend.

- Witness one – Remembers the day the chopper was shot down that was to airlift his crew to safety. They had to wait until morning for the next chopper to arrive. When it came, he attempted to wake up a fellow soldier only to witness his face was missing when he turned him over.
- Witness two – Will never forget the day he witnessed three fellow soldiers losing their lives to enemy fire while serving in Viet Naam.
- Witness three – July 29, 1967 It started out as a beautiful day, but ended with him witnessing the death of 200 soldiers. Bodies were on fire and body parts were dismembered and hurled through the air from exploding bombs. What do these survivors want us to remember as we celebrate Memorial Day?
