**REVIEW:**

- **COLOSSIANS 2:9-10 (AMPC)**
- In Christ we are complete, made whole, perfect.
- We are complete only in Christ, without the aid of human philosophies, or Jewish ceremonies.
- The type or picture is not greater than the reality.
- Animal sacrifices could never make us perfect, but Christ's sacrifice perfects us forever.
- Man's tripart being: spirit, soul and body.

**2 CORINTHIANS 3:18**
