ROM. 10:10

Salvation involves both believing something and saying something. With the heart, one believes unto righteousness. With the mouth, one confesses unto salvation (soteria). Soteria means deliverance, rescue, save, healing, well-being, and preservation. To rescue from the perils of evil was a main interpretation of soteria. In **HEB. 11:7** it's translated "saving" meaning rescue from danger, deliverance, preservation, and safety

MARK 11:23

Jesus mentions believing once and saying three times. He emphasized that believing is not enough to get results. Saying is also necessary. He must have known people would miss it in their saying, not in their believing.

1 JOHN 1:9

Confession involves more than confessing our sins, faults, or failures. Only confessing these builds weakness, failure, and sin consciousness into one's spirit. This is the negative side to confession.

 - **C.)** Testifying to a truth we have embraced.
- **2.)** What we are to confess.
 - **A.)** The finished work of Christ.
 - **B.**) What Jesus is doing for us now.
 - **C.)** Who we are and what we mean to the Father.
 - **D.**) What God is doing in us now by His Spirit and through the Word.
 - **E.)** What God can do through us as we speak His Word.
