About Agape

• A commandment (JOHN 13:34); it's what really matters in Christ (GAL. 5:6); the mark of spiritual maturity (COL. 3:14 AMPC); how we imitate God (EPH. 5:1-2 MSG); is to be eagerly pursued (1 COR. 14:1 MSG); casts out all fear (1 JOHN 4:16b-18 J.B. Phillips); proof of salvation (1 JOHN 3:14); Everyone saved has it (ROM. 5:3-5).

Agape Defined - 1 Cor. 13:4-8a

- 1.) Suffers long. Has a long fuse; not easily angered; not impatient with people when imposed upon. MT. 14:14 Jesus was getting away to rest after hearing of His cousin's death. Instead, He was confronted by a multitude who got word of His location.
- 2.) Is kind. Agape isn't harsh with people no matter how provoked. TITUS 3:3-6 NASB Jesus was gentle and kind even when dealing with sinners (JOHN 8:10-11 AMPC).
- 3.) Envieth not. These Corinthians were envious of the gifts and ministries of others. Satan's fall was fueled by envy. JOHN 17:22 says Jesus shares His glory with everyone.
- 4.) Vaunteth not itself. It doesn't brag, boast, or start a parade to bring attention to oneself. MT. 8:1-4 Jesus didn't want applause. (JER. 9:23-24 NLT). This is what we boast about.
- 5.) Not puffed up. It doesn't inflate itself with pride or think more highly of itself (PHIL. 2:5-8 NLT). Jesus went to the lowest level of humility to save us.
- **6.)** Doesn't behave unseemly. It's not rude or ill-mannered; crude or insensitive; callous. **LUKE 13:16-17** He always showed love and respect.
- 7.) Doesn't seek its own. 1 COR. 10:24 It seeks the well-being of others first (2 COR. 8:9).
- 8.) Not easily provoked. It's not easily offended by what others say or do (PS. 119:165). Doesn't roll the eyes or sigh deeply.

- **9.)** Thinks no evil. Chooses to believe the best, not the worst about people. It doesn't mentally rehearse the faults of others.
- 10.) Rejoices not in iniquity, but in truth. When right and truth prevail, not when things that sent Christ to the Cross prevail.
- 11.) Bears all things. It's slow to expose the sins of others. PR. 10:12 NIV Hatred points out flaws and imperfections, but love covers them (1 PET. 1:22, 4:8); and deals privately with them. (MT. 18:15-17 NLT).
- 12.) Believes all things. It recognizes God's integrity and reliability. NUM. 23:19 It's not skeptical about God's faithfulness.
- 13.) Hopes all things. It looks to the fulfillment of all things (ROM. 12:11-12 AMPC). It's a motivating force (1 JOHN 3:3).
- **14.)** Endures all things. **2 TIM. 2:1-3-NLT** It endures hardness and perseveres under pressure.
- **15.)** Never fails. Why? Because God is love and He never fails. Love is the greatest of all forces.

Conclusion:

Growing in God is growing in love. The greatest challenge to Agape is selfishness. Growing out of selfishness and into love produces spiritual maturity. What are our test results?
