

# RESURRECTION LIFE

## FEBRUARY 14, 2021

### ROM. 8:11

John Calvin, a superb Greek scholar said, “The quickening of the mortal body here cannot refer to the resurrection of the saints but must mean a giving of life to their bodies, while here on earth through the spirit”.

- Quicken means to make alive or make life. The same word is used in **2 COR. 3:6** “The spirit giveth life”.
- Mortal—Gr. thnetos, meaning subject to death. The Greek word for dead body is nekros, never thnetos. **ROM. 6:12** is thnetos, same as **ROMANS 8:11**. Death can’t reign in a lifeless body.

### ROM. 8:26

The Greek for infirmities is the most common word used for sickness. It can also mean weakness.

- Helpeth – means “to take hold together against with”, suggesting we have a part and the spirit has a part.
- The Spirit, who is the maker of life, will take hold together with us as we do our part. We activate His power through prayer.

### ACTS 1:8

Power is dunamis. Jesus was anointed with dunamis (**ACTS 10:38**), Paul also (**ROM. 15:18-19**).

- **ACTS 1:8** Jesus wants every believer to receive the same power (dunamis) after being saved.
- The same Spirit who anointed Jesus and raised Him from the dead, is still at work in the church as the maker of resurrection life.

### ACTS 19:1-2

It’s up to us to receive the Spirit and to continue activating the Spirit’s power in our life (**EPH. 5:17-20**).
